WHAT DO YOU NEED TO BRING WITH YOU?

- Thread: a good all cotton thread to coordinate with your fabrics, personal I like to work with a white cotton thread.
- Cutting Mat: A 12" x 18" mat next to your machine works well.
- Pressing: Finger pressing or a pressing tool works well, but for those of you who like to really press: irons will be provided
- Clover pins # 2507.
- Add-a-Quarter ruler 6"
- A Paper-Creasing Tool: a piece of card-stock or template plastic approximately 2" x 8" works well
- Rulers: I like a small 2 ½" x 6 ½" ruler. It is an all-purpose ruler for small paper-piecing projects. If you have strips to cut from the full width of your fabrics, a 6 ½" x 12 ruler will come in handy.
- Rotary Cutter: 45 mm is great...for those tighter curves, 28 mm is a huge help. A new blade is a necessity!
- Scissors: Small, sharp fabric scissors for just in case.
- Scissors: Large with a sharp blade.
- Zip Lock bags: to store your pieces or fabrics
- Freezer paper.
- Cellophane tape.
- The Original pattern: Bring the original pattern with you to class.
- Fabrics:** Try to cut all the fabrics according to the cutting instructions in the pattern. It saves a lot of time if you are prepared for class and you can start immediately with sewing instead of cutting. So take a few hours of your time in the coming weeks to prepare yourself. Well, try to cut at least the fabrics for the first 3 months and the star fabric for part F in month 5.
- Several bobbins: 3 or 4 Pre-wound bobbins the same as your top thread will save you time in class.
- Sewing machine, power cord, foot pedal with a new needle. Don't forget to clean and oil your machine prior to coming to class. I'm not an expert on the mechanics of your machine. Bringing your manual may help if a problem occurs with your machine while you are in class.
- Machine needles/Microtex : 70/10 Always good to have extras on hand!
- Seam Ripper: We know no one makes a mistake, but just in case; a ripper can come in handy.
- Pencil and / or Pen: And paper, to take notes, if necessary.
- Bottled Water: It's important to hydrate – piecing is hard work! ;-)
- Table lamp, if you need more light
- Something to cover your work space at night

I am so looking forward to meet you all in class. Please don't be afraid; I will show you the most easy way of paper piecing you have ever done and you will see that something that looks so complicated can really be fun and nice!
