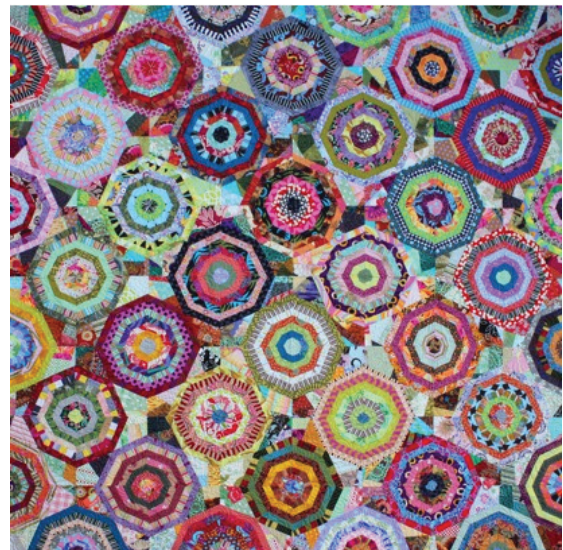
SUPPLY LIST



- Sewing Machine in good working order
- Table-top light
- A multi plug extension cord with surge protection
- Something to cover your work at night
- Basic Sewing tools and supplies
- Zipper foot and zipper for your machine (*if you want to make a pillow*)
- Fabrics – lots of fabrics, strips of fabric. If you are making a traditional 7-ring spider web, you will need 1-1/2” strips... If you are making a 5-ring traditional spider web, you will need 2” strips. If you are making a liberated, fussy cut or variable sized ring spider web, bring scraps and yardage.
- Muslin... for your foundation piecing
- June Tailor’s *Shape Cut* (JT-796) Ruler is recommended for making strips as well as perfectly squaring your blocks.
- June Tailor’s *Grid Marker* (JT-717) is

recommended for marking your muslin quickly and accurately

- If making the large Dual Spider web, you will need to be able to square up a 24” block, bring a ruler that you can work with. I went to a Plastics Warehouse and had them cut me a 24” square from Plexiglas to use. However, you could also scale down to your largest size ruler you own. You might also bring some template plastic.
- A “kite” template (\$10.00) will be available for purchase in class
- Neutral colored cotton thread for piecing
