Your Photo

If you work from your own image, take time to study it. Edit the photo as needed to get the image you want on the page.

Print 3 color copies of the (edited) photo on 8.5" x 11" (letter size) paper.

Consider the finished size you want your quilt to be. The bigger it is, the more time it takes at every step which is fine—it's just important to understand going in. I will teach you how to manually take your small drawing up to the scale you want.

If you choose the Water Lily...

I will provide a PDF with the pages to all students before class. If you want to make this quilt, print the pages before class. You can wait to trim and tape them together or do that before class.

Fabric

Think about your image and choose colors you are likely to need. Bring as much fabric as you can, within reason. Fat quarters or smaller work best for me rather than yardage. Tone-on-tone, plaids, stripes, prints, and solids — from light to dark — can all work but it is hard to predict the best fabrics until you get shapes cut and on the design wall.
