20" - side panelsFat 1/8 (2) - top and bottom panelsFat quarters of 1-2 stem fabrics6 " of 3 Leaf fabrics$10^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ of $4-7$ bird fabrics10" Circle fabricMisc scraps for wings, flowers and tails$2^{\prime \prime} \times 6$ " assorted rectangles for sashing (approximately 5 yds long)

## Quarter Squares

6" (4) Two large scale and two small scale
## Print Triangles

$\square$ 5" of 16-20 strips

## Background (Gingham)Triangles

$\square 8^{\prime \prime}$ of 7 strips

## Circles

$\square$ (16) $\times 3^{\prime \prime}$ finished circles
