## MATERIALS: **TOOLS AND SUPPLIES: Medallion Background:** ☐ Kaleido Ruler – Marti Michell or other\* ☐ Fat Quarter A Kaleido Ruler is not a Half Square Triangle. The 45degree point is opposite the flat side of the triangle. 20" - side panels Eight Kaleido Triangles make a square. $\Box$ Fat 1/8 (2) - top and bottom panels ☐ Perfect Circles ☐ Fat quarters of 1–2 stem fabrics ☐ Wash Away Applique Paper ☐ 6" of 3 Leaf fabrics ☐ Glue Stick ☐ 10" x 10" of 4–7 bird fabrics ☐ Mary Ellen's Best Press ☐ 10" Circle fabric ☐ Applique Pins ☐ Misc scraps for wings, flowers and tails ☐ 60wt Efina thread ☐ 2" x 6" assorted rectangles for sashing ☐ Sewing Machine (approximately 5 yds long) ☐ General Sewing Supples **Quarter Squares** ☐ If driving, bring a multi-plug extension cord with surge $\Box$ 6" (4) Two large scale and two small scale protection **Print Triangles** ☐ Table top light ☐ 5" of 16-20 strips ☐ Something to cover your work at night **Background (Gingham) Triangles** ☐ 8" of 7 strips Circles
