

Medallion Medley - An Artfully Composed Scrap Quilt

Sewing Machine required

Level- Experienced Beginner

This workshop is a fantastic opportunity for students to explore their creativity while learning valuable quilting techniques! By focusing on a bright and sparkly aesthetic, participants will be encouraged to experiment with colors and textures in new ways, ensuring each quilt is as unique as the quilter creating it. With the central motif as a starting point, the process of integrating leftover blocks with newly made units will not only be a creative challenge but also a fun exercise in making mindful design decisions.

It's a wonderful way to make something beautiful out of materials that might otherwise go unused! By using leftover blocks and scraps, you can incorporate a variety of colors, shapes, and patterns that may not have been planned initially but come together to form a cohesive and visually appealing design.

Basic Sewing Supplies

Sewing Machine,

Thread, pins, scissors

Design wall felt or batting

Fabric in yardage and scraps, and leftover blocks

Fabric scissors

Rotary cutting supplies – mat, rotary cutter with fresh blade and ruler

Yardage Requirements

Leftover Blocks – Make sure the block is appealing to you and can serve as a focal point. You could also make a whole new medallion for the center. You will be making new units to tie the old blocks or the medallion and fill in the gaps in the design.

Scraps – Variety of colors (bright and dull), patterns and prints that are pleasing to you and complimenting the leftover blocks

Yardage – Mix of black and white prints, solids, dots, and stripes.
