



Scrappy Snacks: Small Designs with Big Impact Supply List

Learn how to play with color and pattern with a low-stakes commitment. Timna will demonstrate how to dig through your scrap bag to make stripey mini circles. Each circle is its own color study but will play well with others so you can turn them into a larger project. Be careful though, these circles are like potato chips – you will want a whole handful.

Bring:

- Supply Fee of \$15
- Assorted light colored 5" squares for the backgrounds. For a quilt that finishes at 45"x45", you'll need 100 squares, but your quilt can be any size.
- Small scraps of fabric for the circles. Don't cut strips to size, but you will want the scraps to be at least 1.5" x 4.5". It is more important to have a wide variety of fabrics than large pieces of fabric. Bring more than you think you'll need. If you are able, please bring extra scraps to share.
- Sewing machine. A machine that zig-zags or does a blanket stitch is helpful for the appliqué, but a straight-stitch only machine will also work.
- Basic sewing supplies including, seam ripper, pins, your favorite scissors, and piecing thread.
- Thread to use for appliqueing the circles. In my quilts I use Mono-poly clear thread for my appliqué. If you prefer to use a cotton or other thread, bring that.
- Small, pointy scissors are helpful but not necessary.
- Cutting mat, rotary cutter, and small rulers (6"x6" and 4"x14" are good sizes to use, but don't buy anything special – bring what you have on hand).

Optional:

- Small iron and mat. Irons must have auto shut off.
- Task light
- Seam roller

Design boards will be provided.

Timna will have Mono-poly thread for sale if you need it.
